APRIL EXHIBITIONS

Pushing The Limits

When the Central Coast Printmakers (CCP) were planning their April 4 to May 11, 2014 Gray Wing biennial, they

entitled their exhibition Traditional Printmaking: Pushing the Limits because they wanted to challenge California printmakers to create compelling, meaningful art within the parameters of original printmaking media without the use of newer technologies.

CCP's efforts were successful according to their juror Linda Lyke, a printmaking professor and artist from Los Angeles, who wrote "The eponymous focus of the exhibition challenged each artist to create meaningful work that pushes the

boundaries of traditional techniques. Far from being constrained by the parameters, I believe the breadth of work selected points to current printmaking's limitless directions. As I have discovered teaching printmaking to students at

Occidental College, it is in the act of understanding and working with a process that artists find their own voice. The printmaker draws inspiration through thoughtful articulation of each medium. This is especially apparent in the work by



silkscreen, linocut, or lithography. Viewing the entries, I was impressed with the quality of technical innovation and visual decision making exercised by the artists to express such a wide range of subject and idea. The work gathered in the exhibit is wonderfully innovative, yet Donna Day Westerman, Spotted Oak, reduction woodcut grounded in sensitive personal

March 17, 2014, 7 pm *Herb and Dorothy*

Director: Megumi Sasaki, 2009, 87 minutes, English Herb & Dorothy tells the extraordinary story of how a postal clerk and a librarian managed to build one of the most important contemporary art collections in history with very modest means. In the early 1960s, when very little attention was paid to Minimalist and Conceptual Art, Herb and Dorothy Vogel quietly began purchasing the works of unknown artists guided by two rules: the piece had to be affordable, and it had to be small enough to fit in their onebedroom Manhattan apartment. Within these limitations, they proved themselves curatorial visionaries: most of those they supported and befriended went on to become world-renowned artists including Sol LeWitt, Christo and Jeanne-Claude, Richard Tuttle, Chuck Close, Robert and Sylvia Mangold, Lynda Benglis, Pat Steir, Robert Barry, Lucio Pozzi, and Lawrence Weiner.



April 21, 2014, 7 pm All About Prints

Director: Christopher Noey, 2009, 55 minutes, English *All About Prints* is a documentary exploring the art of printmaking from the perspective of influential curators, collectors, dealers, printmakers, and artists. The film touches on the wider history of prints in Western art with an emphasis on key landmarks of printmaking in America. Visually engaging explanations of printmaking terms and techniques are sure to inspire a deeper understanding and appreciation of printmaking as a distinctive art.

Shot in Hi-Def video at museum print rooms, print fairs, galleries, and print workshops in America and Europe, *All About Prints* explores the collaborative nature of printmaking, the democratic character of multiples, and the deeprooted traditions of the art form. The documentary profiles masters of the 19th century like Homer and Whistler; the important contribution of Edward Hopper; the influence of Mexican muralists; the formative years of the Federal Art Project of the WPA; the excitement of the 60s print boom; and the ever-evolving techniques of contemporary artists such as Kiki Smith.◆
