This summer, the San Luis Obispo Museum of Art presents Blue Marble, a national juried exhibition in the Gray Wing on view June 3 to July 31. Blue Marble welcomed artists of all media to delve into subjects, themes, and motifs that have to do with our planet. The exhibition received 149 submissions, of which 52 were selected. Blue Marble is truly a national exhibition, featuring the work of 33 artists hailing from 9 states, from California to Ohio to New York, 9 of whom are members of the Museum of Art. Artwork included in the exhibition was selected by Juror Patricia Watts, founder and west coast curator of Ecoartspace. Says Ms. Watts, "Blue Marble is the symbol of the ultimate turning point in our human consciousness. The artists in this exhibition have captured a visual sense of what it means to be here on this planet, with the perspective of being a part of something larger, a dot in the Universe. The struggle to maintain balance with nature. the understanding of the fragility of nested ecosystems, and the participation in a dialogue of what natural resources are left and what can be saved, moving forward, is on the minds of most every living artist today."

In conjunction with *Blue Marble*, SLOMA will host Dr. Jill Thayer on Thursday, June 2 at 12 PM for an *Art at High Noon* lecture entitled, "Global Visual Culture: Contemporary Art and the Environment." Art at High Noon lectures are free and open to the public. \blacklozenge

Bay Area artist Virginia Harrison's sculptural work combines two ancient disciplines: weaving and metal work. However, her work is also strongly influenced by Chicago jazz. Ms. Harrison says, "I was in a blues club in Chicago, listening to Little Milton, when I first discovered my ability to transform the sounds

Doron Gazit: The Red Line Through May 30



Doron Gazit creates environmental art installations using wind and pneumatic tubes to draw attention to the ravaging effects of climate change in diverse locations from the Dead Sea to the Central Coast of California. He places

air tubes, some as long as 500 feet, in dry seas, reservoirs, and river beds and then photographs them from a distance. The tubes are red, forming a three-dimensional line, which contrasts with the muted earth tones of the baked and burnt landscape.

Running Fence depicts the historic struggle by artists Christo and Jeanne-Claude to build a 24 mile fence of white fabric over the hills of California disappearing into

the Pacific. The idea at first must seem the limit of absurdity for the fence was taken down as planned at the end of two weeks and now exists solely on film. After four years of work, Christo sees their vision realized: "See how it describes the wind."

June 20, 7 PM Troublemakers: The Story of Land Art 72 minutes, English, 2015.



Troublemakers unearths the history of land art in the tumultuous late 1960s and early 1970s. The film includes rare footage and interviews with storied artists Robert Smithson (*Spiral Jetty*), Walter De Maria (*The Lightning Field*) and Michael Heizer (*Double Negative*); a headstrong troika of

renegade artists that established the genre. +
