Pressing Matters October 7 – November 13

Showcasing the twin disciplines of fine art original prints and artist books, Central Coast Printmakers and SLOMA presents *Pressing Matters*, a juried exhibition open to artists in California, Oregon, and Washington. The selected handmade prints and artist books will be on view in the Gray Wing from October 7 – November 13, 2016. Artists were challenged to utilize traditional printmaking processes to comment on contemporary issues. This compelling composite invites viewers to witness how artists convey substantial social topics. Using serigraphy, letterpress, collagraphy, etching, woodcut, lithography, linocut, drypoint, mezzotint, monoprint, and solar plates, the artworks are both beautiful and significant.

Pressing Matters juror is Archana Horsting, co-founder and executive director of KALA Art Institute and Gallery in Berkeley, California. Ms. Horsting studied at UC Davis and UC Santa Cruz and spent many years abroad. She attended the University of Padua as well as the Venice Art Academy. After graduating, she worked as an apprentice to a sculptor in Italy and studied at Atelier 17, a workshop in Paris started by Stanley William Hayter, where she focused on printmaking. Sixty-five artists, mostly from California, but with a few artists from Oregon and Washington, submitted their artwork to the jurying process.

"Central Coast Printmakers is pleased to award a total of \$1,500 in cash prizes. Both artisitic disciplines will receive a \$500 Juror's Award and two \$125 Honorable Mention Awards," said Barbara Rosenthal, exhibit chairperson.

A members-only gallery walk will take place on Friday, October 7, at 5 pm, followed by a public reception and awards ceremony open to the public from 6–9 pm, in conjunction with Art After Dark. \blacklozenge

Etcetera: Sculpture & Drawings by Trent Burkett Through October 2

September | October 2016

The Museum of Art presents *Etcetera*, an exhibition of sculpture and drawings by Arroyo Grande artist Trent Burkett on view through October 2, 2016.



Trent Burkett creates raw, processoriented art installations in wood, clay, marble, paint, oil, steel, and found objects. His artwork is intentionally minimal and devoid of specific meaning.

The origins and quality of Burkett's materials are of utmost importance. For example, a marble chunk from the historic Yule Quarry in Marble, Colorado reveals the blue quarry marks in the finished piece.

Burkett intensely researches and fashions his own art materials, such as cobalt blue glaze and custom-made oil sticks. He needs these materials to behave in a very specific manner in order to achieve his aesthetic goals. ◆

Cen Dallidet: At the Edge of a New World

Offering inspiration and an aesthetic bridge to San Luis Obispo's past, SLOMA and The History Center of San Luis Obispo County are pleased to present a glimpse of San Luis Obispo on the brink of the 20th century.

Cen Dallidet: At the Edge of a New World is on exhibit from September 2 through October 2, 2016 in the Art Museum's Nybak Wing.

Maria Ascension "Cen" Dallidet (1859–1913) was born in San Luis Obispo, the eldest daughter of the pioneering vintner Pierre Dallidet and Ascencion Concepcion Salazar. Showing both independence and gumption, Miss Dallidet traveled to art school in San Francisco in the 1890s. In the 1960s, the SLO Historical Society pulled her artwork from the basement of the old adobe home and preserved it. ◆
